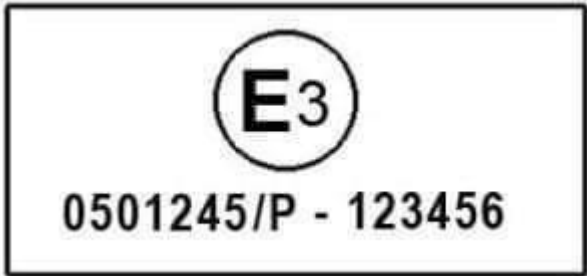

An ECE approved helmet can be recognized by the label on the chin strap, which consists of a large E in a circle with a number, the number corresponding to a country. UK is E11, Italy is E3, and so on.

The numbers next to the E mark is (in order) the type of approval (**05** or **06**), then the helmet approval number, the type of protection the helmet offers /J (jet or open face helmets) /P (protective chin bar for full face helmets) etc. followed by a hyphen then the production serial number.
